#### **Event Chronicle**

#### A Brief History of the Year 59, part I

being a series of entries from the daybook of Mistress Eowyn Eilonwy of Alewife Brook

May 1 -- Mayday: As ever, the year began fairly in Carolingia. The plague called the 19th Covid had greatly decreased, from a catastrophe to an annoyance. Magnus Tindal & George Emerson True sat the Thrones of the East, and Barone Frithuric Ulman & Baronessa Fiore Lionetta Bardi together held the coronet.

May 18 -- the feast of St. Eric of Sweden: The long-time annual festival called Otter's Welcome was held. There were, as usual, activities of all types, many arranged to attract the interest of newcomers to the barony. Those held outside were plagued by occasional rain, but even so continued when they could, to the pleasure of those taking part. Inside the hall, classes and other pastimes occurred, and a dayboard lunch was served. In the late afternoon, the Barone & Baronessa held a session of their court, at which they did these things:

They thanked the Baron & Baroness of Stonemarche for helping to supervise the activities directed at children -- as neither of Carolingia's Chancellors Minor had been able to be present to perform this duty.

They gave gifts to the newcomers present, & to the event steward.

Members of the Forest Court of Carolingia delivered the long-promised coronet boxes to the Barone & Baronessa, who in turn promised to return to the guild its tithe box.

The youth called Dante of the Golden Bow was recognized for showing greater endurance at the butts than any other, despite the rain.

Count Matthias Grunewald received a prize as winner of the thrown weapons contest, one called Alex was noted as best scorer among the newcomers to the art, and a child named Willow was given a toy cow as the most tenacious thrower.

Mistress Ygraine of Kellswood received a gift for constructing a reliquary box to hold a clod of dirt from the site of the very first Carolingian event, to preserve it as a ritual item.

Five folk were inducted into the Order of the Moon, each receiving a suitable medallion; they were Lord Hermankyn, Baroness Phaedra de Vere, Baroness Linnet del Grenewode, Baron Kenrick del Grenewode, and Mistress Isabel del Okes.

Lord Donato Favro was inducted into the Order of the Daystar, receiving a medallion.

Then, after thanking all who had assisted in the day's activities, the Barone & Baronessa closed their court, and the event ended.

From May 24 -- the feast of St. Hermes Trismegistus, the patron of alchemy -- to May 27 -- the Feast of St. Bede the Venerable, the patron of English history: The Shire of Panther Vale held its annual Panteria festival. The usual activities took place, but also, Prince Matthew & Princess Fiamuin, the newly-chosen heirs to the Throne, held court on behalf of King Magnus & King Emerson. Explaining that the Kings had suggested they might want to practice this ritual Just In Case, the Princes Princess bestowed a few awards, then presided as the event steward thanked various folk for their assistance, including for providing the excellent weather. Princess Fiamuin responded by thanking the steward for generating a weekend without snow.

June 1 -- the feast of St. Wistan of Evesham: Barone Frithuric & Baronessa Fiore attended a regular baronial rapier practice, there to preside over a contest to choose their new rapier champion. Matthew of Carolingia, who would retire from that honor, acted as list master for this tourney. The weather was fine, and the 14 contestants began with a round robin of bouts; originally they continued to the best of 5 bouts between each pair, but given the heat of the day, after a while Lord Matthew proposed shifting to the best of 3 bouts, which the contestants agreed to. Meanwhile, some Waytes played tunes, a few Low Companions played at games, and other onlookers picnicked at their ease while watching the tourney.

When the initial round finished, Lord Matthew presented the results to the Barone & Baronessa: Don Gregori Rogue Montana led, followed by a tie between Lord Gabriel Roberts, from Quintavia, & Scholar Anezka Liska z Kolina, and then a further tie among Lord Scrooby, Lord Iago Gallego y Hidalgo, & a Lady called Nissa. At that point Nissa & Lord Scrooby withdrew from the tourney, conveniently leaving 4 semi-finalists.

Of these, Don Gregori & Scholar Anezka won their first pairings, and Don Gregori went on to win the final. He then begged the indulgence of the Barone & Baronessa, that they conduct any resulting formalities with him quickly, as he had an obligation elsewhere later in the afternoon.

Therefore they proceeded to hold their court forthwith, and did these things:

They thanked Lord Matthew for his service, accepted back his champion's regalia, & gave him a token of their esteem. Then they called Don Gregori forward, presenting him with the regalia -- a tabard, collar, & sword; he donned these & joined their entourage.

However, the Baronessa then explained that they had decided to do something new, to spread the load of the champion's service. So, she said, Don Gregori will act as the Baron's Champion -- while Scholar Anezka will be the Baroness's. Scholar Anezka promptly came forward, received regalia of a morion-style helmet & a card-woven baldric, and likewise joined the baronial entourage.

Also, two new companions were inducted into the Order of Perseus: Lord Matthew and Lord Iago. Lord Matthew received a medallion, but none was available for Lord Iago (in such informal circumstances, very few folk wore such gauds, so no one had a medallion on hand to loan), so the Barone & Baroness promised to deliver one to him as soon as they could. Thus the court ended.

A second tourney took place then, one of many being held throughout the realm, to aid the Royalty & Their advisors in choosing Their Heroic Champions team for the upcoming Pennsic War. This was followed by rapier melee practice -- with spears on each side as well -- and other forms of training. At length, when all were tired out, the practice ended.

From July 11 -- the translatio of St. Benedict, the patron of coppersmiths & schoolchildren -- to July 14 -- the feast of St. Swithin, who wept in heaven, causing 10 days of rain: The Province of Malagentia (those -bad-people) held its annual Great North-Eastern War event. The weather was extremely hot & humid, but all the usual activities took place. This year the Malagentians had arranged that they would lead one force, while their neighbors from Stonemarche would lead the other, in a competition concerning certain invading hordes of vorpal hares.

The Kings were present, and held several sessions of Their Court. Among many other matters that came before Them were these:

Lord Wilhelm Van Hammaburc, a recent Carolingian Armored Combat Champion, was inducted into the Order of the Tygers Combattant. He received 2 medallions, one of them being a legacy handed down through his household.

Lord Richard Heyworth was inducted into the Order of the Silver Wheel, receiving a friend's medallion.

One of those inducted into the Order of the Silver Crescent had the award commemorated not by an ordinary paper certificate, but by a stained-glass panel.

When Cedric Campbell -- called Cedric of the Floppy Hat -- came forward to answer Their Majesties' offer to induct him into the Order of Defense, his peregrinations were reflected by the witnesses to his worth; several sent their words by letter from as far as Drachenwald and Lochac.

Some of the teams for various tourneys to be held at the upcoming Pennsic War were announced. These included the Unbelted Armored Combat Team, who were named by the team Captain, Baron Ludovic of Carolingia.

When Lord Mat Wyk, the Seneschal of Malagentia, was inducted into the Order of the Pelican, he swore fealty to the Crown -- but with the permission of Their Majesties, instead of using the Sword of State for this purpose, he used a sword made by the late & much missed Master Gregory Finche, a citizen of Malagentia.

From July 27 -- the Feast of St. Pantaleon the Physician, the patron of trousers -- to 11 August -- the Feast of both St. Susanna of Rome and St. Tiburtius of Rome: This year's Pennsic War gathering was held. The usual activities took place, though the weather was for much of the time hot and often stormy -- enough so that on a few days, several activities were forced to be cancelled. Fortunately, the weather moderated for the last few days of the fortnight, to the great relief of those present.

It is said that the Kings conducted several sessions of Their Court, doing these things among many others:

Baroness Arlyana van Wyck was presented with a Writ, summoning her to a future court session (to be chosen at the mutual convenience of Their Majesties & herself), there to answer whether she was willing to be inducted into the Order of the Pelican. Their Majesties especially commended her labors in the Exchequer, among her many other virtues.

The Company of the Pennon of the East inducted several new members, including Master Giles William Trout called BillyFish, Baroness Roskva mac Cianain called Widowmaker, Baron Ludovic of Carolingia, & Baroness Maegwynn filia Brun.

Lady Anezka Liska z Kolina was inducted into the Order of the Silver Brooch.

Bonheddig Gavin Kent received the cup of a Companion of the Order of the Troubador.

Scholar Katerina Falconer de Lanark was inducted into the Order of the Silver Crescent.

Master Steffan ap Cenydd of Silverwing, for decades a pillar of the Canton of the Towers before he removed to the Bridge, was welcomed into the company of the Tygers of the East.

And several new companions were inducted into the Order of the Rabbit in the Moon, including Mistress Raziya bint Rusa, a former Baroness of Carolingia.

At the end of each Pennsic War, it is traditional for the opposing sides to meet formally, to count the winners of the various contests and so arrive at a judgement as to which side won that year. This year, as usual, the East and the Middle had led the two sides. However, when the war had been opened, the royalty had jointly announced that they wished this year's gathering to be a celebration rather than a competition. So no such final accounting was held.

Sept. 7 -- the feast of St. Memorius & his Companion, whose name alas is forgotten: The annual festival of Falling Leaves took place, and besides its usual diversity of activities, hosted Carolingia's contest for Thrown Weapons Champion. Cleverly, the day's schedule was arranged to provide a break from all organized activities shortly after noon, so that those present could lunch without stress. There was also a demonstration of jousting, a new sport in these parts.

After preliminary rounds, the weapon-throwing contest was reduced from nine entrants to four semi-finalists: Master Symon of Barnsdale, Master Peregrine the Illuminator, Lady Deirdre Grenewode, and Lord Hermankyn.

They threw at targets marked as clock quarters, with the thrower having to choose whether to go clockwise or counterclockwise. Master Symon & Lord Hermankyn each won their first paired contest, then faced each other, with Master Symon winning the final set of throws.

At the end of the day, Barone Frithuric & Baronessa Fiore held a session of their court, at which they did these things:

They welcomed the Baron & Baroness Beyond the Mountain, inviting these guests to join them as they sat in state.

They thanked the event steward, & gave her gifts for herself & her staff.

Master Donovan Shinnock was named as winner of the fencing tourney, receiving as his prize a bowl turned by Master Valerian of Somerset from wood brought home from the Pennsic forest.

Prizes were given for the armored combat tourney: Sir Matthew, who won, received a leather pouch made in the style of the 15th century, with leather buttons bearing the Carolingian badge, and Lord Valgard, who placed second, received a pair of demi-gauntlets. Both prizes had been made by Baron Ludovic.

Master Peter the Red described the several archery shoots he had supervised, and thanked those who had assisted him.

Baronessa Fiore spoke of the equestrian activities held during the day, noting that the site was notably well-arranged for folk to watch the riders, and that the riders had told her they were delighted to have had such an audience.

The Barone & Baronessa welcomed all newcomers and gave them gifts, and thanked Master Hillarious Clockwerk for bringing his communications device, that all present might know what was being said.

Lord Pandaulf, the champion weapons-thrower, returned his regalia of a tabard, a collar of office, and an ax engraved with the names of all the previous champions; the Barone & Baronessa presented him with a cup as a parting gift, and he retired. Then the day's throwing marshalls discussed the various throwing contests that day, commending a new thrower called Christoff who did very well in the champion's throw, but didn't stay for the finals. Master Symon was named as the winner of that contest; he was invested with the Champion's regalia, and joined the baronial entourage.

Then Master Symon called for the banner of the Perseids. When it was brought to him, he explained, as Principal of the Order of Perseus, what it concerns, and asked the Barone & Baronessa to induct a new companion. This was Master Giles William Trout, called BillyFish, who received a suitable medallion.

That being the last item of business, the court was closed, and the event then ended.

Oct. 5 -- the Feast of SS. Placid, Eutychius, Victorinus, Flavia, Donatus, Firmatus, Faustus, & their Companions: The Kings went to Stonemarche to hold sessions of Their court.

In the morning session, They had dealt with a few matters of business -- including sending Baroness Arlyana van Wyck to sit vigil concerning whether to join the Order of the Pelican -- when Prince Matthew formally approached Them. The Prince, while commending Their reign heretofore, noted that there was unrest in various parts of the East, and that the Kings were clearly growing weary from the burdens of office. He therefore proposed that They retire, and let him & his consort take up that charge. After brief thought, the Kings agreed, asking only a little further time to tidy up some loose ends. These included King Emerson introducing his fiance to the company assembled, and also, in his office as Royal Consort, inducting King Tindal into the Consort's Order of Courtesy. Among other awards They presented at that time, several folk were given the Sovereign's Cypher, including Dona Magdelena von Kirschberg & Master Luke Knowlton; several received the Consort's Esteem award, including Baroness Maegwynn filia Brun; and four including Mistress Ygraine of Kellswood were named Seamsters to the Crown for making King Emerson's shirts. Then They dismissed all Their attendants with Their thanks.

At this point Prince Matthew & Princess Fiamuin came forward, and the Kings went to meet them. The Prince & Princess swore the oaths of service read out by the Brigantia Herald upon divers relics of the site of the First Tourney. Then the Kings removed their crowns and crowned Their Heirs, and with the permission of the new King & Queen, withdrew. After the Great Officers & the Eastern Baronage swore their continued service, & the Tygers of the East affirmed their continued counsel to the Crown, the King & Queen asked the peers of the realm to continue their various good works, and suspended Their court.

A lunch was then set out in the lower hall, while an array of award certificates were displayed in an upstairs chamber, a wind consort performed in the main hall, and Their Majesties sat in state for the benefit of any who wished to approach Them. Also during this interval, the Barone & Baronessa of Carolingia, by the grace of their cousins of Stonemarche, held a brief Carolingian court. At this time they accepted the tithe of cheese delivered by one Lord Gaius, who had recently removed to Carolingia from Malagentia.

Royal court reconvened in the early afternoon. In the traditional fashion, Brigantia read the Roll of Kings of the East while King Matthew & Queen Fiamuin approached the thrones. They then did these things among others:

As is often done by the royalty, They named their son Lord Galen as Prince Royal.

They invited Mistress Deirdre Planchett, Baroness of Stonemarche, to join them to sit in state. She did so, explaining that Baron Keziah had very recently fallen ill & thus was unable to be present. With Royal permission she then held a brief baronial court, noting the Barony's birthday and presenting a few local awards. The Queen exchanged gifts with her, and asked whether she wished to present Them with rocks, as Stonemarche traditionally does. Baroness Deirdre asked Their permission to delay this ritual until sometime during the coming winter, when she & the Baron would reach the end of their term of office -- and this was allowed.

They called forward Their troop of royal guards, so that the Queen could put livery hoods on each one; the captain introduced his lieutenants, and their chief advisor, Sir Trentus Nubianus.

They asked to meet any newcomers; a single one appeared, whom They greeted fairly & presented with the usual token of a mug.

Among the many awards They presented were these:

Following the usual custom, Master Emerson was made an Earl and a Companion of the Order of the Rose -- with the Queen announcing that if anyone should dispute his eligibility for that order, "We'll send the Eastern Army to trounce them."

Sir Tindal had already become a Duke before he had moved to the East some years ago, but as this had been his second Eastern reign, King Matthew crowned him with a new coronet, to mark his state as a Duke of the East.

Master Giles William Trout called BillyFish and Sir Trentus each received a token of the Queen's Esteem. Sir Trentus was also set a quest: Evidently, some time before, he had accidently taken King Matthew's "emergency knight's belt". He had later returned it, but the King & Queen now directed him to make sure each new knight who is made has such an emergency belt.

Baroness Arlyana arrived from her vigil, and agreed to join the Order of the Pelican. Several local peers testified to her virtues & worth, including Laureata Fiore Lionetta Bardi for the Laurels, and Master Aquel of Darksted Wode, on behalf of both himself & his lady wife Mistress Johanna Dudley, for the Pelicans. The herald asked whether any member of the populace also wished to testify, and Lord Donato Favro stepped forward to do so. Mistress Arlyana received several items of regalia, including a medallion from Master Aquel that had been worn by several other Pelicans, a cloak, a hat, & a veil. After she swore her fealty on the Sword of State, the other Pelicans present brought her aside to congratulate her.

After thanking Their clothiers & the makers of Their Guards' hoods, the King & Queen closed the court session. And that being the last activity of the day, the event then ended.
